AACUSS Student Leadership Award

(Proposed and reviewed March 24th, 2022 - Approved by Executive on March 6th, 2022)

Description:

The Student Leadership Award is designed to encourage participation and engagement by a student leader in the AACUSS annual conference. The Award celebrates significant accomplishments to a campus community and encourages student leaders to consider Student Affairs as a career option beyond graduation. The nominee demonstrates a commitment to the field of Student Affairs and Services through their active role on their campus.

How to Apply/Nominate:

- Submit award ONLINE (form and a supporting letter of recommendation).
- Nominations for the Student Leadership Award must come from a current AACUSS member.

Criteria for Consideration:

- The extent to which the student has made significant contributions to their campus community
- The level of enthusiasm and support for the student as expressed in the nomination letter(s) of support.
- The potential and/or interest of the student in considering a career/future working in student affairs or other post-secondary roles.
- A description of how the student will participate and/or benefit from participation in the Annual Conference.

Nominations which recognize contributions of racialized students, Indigenous students, and students with disabilities are strongly encouraged. Additional consideration will be given to nominations of underrepresented student leaders.

Award Details:

The Award is for reasonable and relevant costs of conference attendance at the AACUSS annual conference. The student will receive an award to be presented at the Annual Conference and/or the AGM. AACUSS will fund and book accommodations, travel, conference registration, and food expenses in full for the award winner with receipts*. The student award winner will not be accountable for any financial costs. The award winner should be contacted at least TWO months ahead of the conference. This will allow the award winner time and planning to attend the conference.

*Receipts need to be provided to the Treasurer and will be reimbursed for meals outside of those provided at the conference, at a maximum of the AACUSS per diem rates for travel. Accommodations will be provided at the lowest cost option, usually at the host institution residences. Travel will be provided at the lowest cost option, if carpooling is an option, it is encouraged
